





Please Note*~ ICHO does not do rush orders, please submit all registration paperwork 6 mos before the certificate is needed, so there is plenty of time to complete them. Registrations maybe be finished earlier, it all depends on how many are ahead of your submission. Transfers only take a few days, so it is much faster to transfer an already registered horse.

Imports/Exports~ Please buy and sell only registered horses for import/export so you have everything you need for quarantine requirements which includes the registration certificate. Paperwork submitted to ICHO late for quarantine requirements will have a \$300.00 penalty applied. Please ask before submission if the Registrar can process the paperwork for quarantine if they are submitted late. Penalty will apply per horse, if registration is needed sooner than 6 months time frame.

Hi, I am Jackie Richardson your ICHO/NACHR Registrar. I have been a Curly Horse breeder/owner for somewhere near 17 years or so. I raised Quarter Horses and Paints before I found Curlies and have loved horses my entire life.



My grandfather got me started in my love of horses by accident. He took me to the local sale barn when I was around 4 years old and I was determined to climb all over any horse that would let me. It has come to our attention, that there has been some confusion about the **Breeding Certificate** in Section 3 on the registration form top of page 2. See below:

Section 3. Breeding Certificate- Signatures & Date Required for registration

This is a new version above, the old form had this area in grey. Since it was grey some thought this was for office use only, but it is for recording Curly breeding for the horse being registered. The breeders certificate is used to verify the breeding of a mare to a stallion on a date by a breeding method. This is required for registering offspring of that breeding. You also need permission to use a breeder's designation if you do not have it registered in your name, for naming this horse, you will see that area also needs a signature.

*The mare owner and the stallion owner signs breeding certificate and marks the date of breeding and how the horse was bred, pasture, natural, AI or frozen semen.

ICHO requires this area completed for registrations to protect the mare and stallion owner against falsified breedings or unpaid for breedings. ICHO can keep accurate breeding records for both mares and stallions and their offspring by comparing it to stallion reports so everything matches and is on file. This keeps every breeding above board and honest for all owners. We do not register breeders in ICHO, so that is another reason we need signed breeding certificates, as this validates the breeding for all eligible foals. So be sure this area is completed and signed when registering all Curly horses.

Stallion owners, when your stallion breeds a mare give a signed Breeding Certificate to the mare owner. **Mare owners**/or lessees, sign the same form at time of breeding, so when you sell the foal or register them yourself, you have the breeding documented.

The owner of the dam or lessee of dam is the first owner of the foal when it is born, <u>unless you have a written contract</u> <u>stating otherwise</u>. For example if you sell a bred mare, bred to your stallion and you have kept the ownership rights to the foal. This needs to be clearly stated in a contract. Most of the time, the first owner of the foal is the mare/dam owner at time of birth. When a foal is sold, the first buyer is the second owner of the horse. If the horse is not registered, the new owner/buyer will need to submit a registration form as well as a transfer form that includes the breeding certificate signed. This is so ICHO can

document the legal change of ownership from first owner to first buyer. This also protects horse owners as well, so we know this was a planned approved sale and the horse was not stolen and is completely paid for during the sale. To sell a horse you have to be the legal owner (or agent with written contract) Only the seller can sign the transfer form to new owner. First Registrations and Transfer can be done at the same time and first buyer can be listed on the certificate as owner.

So remember to get signatures on the Breeding certificate on the registration form and if you are the new owner of the horse you also need the transfer form signed by the seller. This is a requirement for ICHO. Thank you!

*Incomplete registrations and transfers submitted to the office now have a time frame of 90 days for US and 120 days for Canada and Overseas to be completed by the owner/submitter. Incomplete items include: incorrect payment, no payment, missing photos, missing hair sample, missing information, forms, signatures, etc. All missing items need to be submitted within the above time frames or the paperwork goes into a dead file and will not be processed. Everything must be resubmitted as well as new payment to get the process started again. Why? There is a backlog of incomplete paperwork that is years old piling up in the office and registrars files. It takes too much time for the office and registrar to weed thru years of old work that owners did-n't complete and try to get it current. This slows things down for current correct paperwork as well. So to speed up the process, we now have limits on how long incomplete paperwork is active. You will receive an email or a written notice from the office or registrar of what is missing and is needed to complete you paperwork. You will get another reminder and then it is up to you to follow thru to complete your work.

The best remedy is to be sure to send everything correctly before it gets to the office. We also do not accept any photos emailed except for the one certificate photo. The office and registrar do not have the time to resize and print emailed photos for all views. Please be sure you send photos on photo paper with every registration, 4 views required, left and right sides, full front view with head up and rear view. Do not cut off head or ears or feet. We are also receiving registrations that have incomplete pedigrees, all horses must be listed by their registered name and prefix with COLOR, Reg#, and all registries listed. If this is not complete it slows down the registrar. Every incomplete form we get slows down everyone's paperwork. Thanks for your help in making the

registration and transfer process work faster. Right now most submissions are incomplete, around 90%, we would like to get that down to 1% ^(C) You can help us save time and process the work faster by submitting only complete paperwork. We processed around 150 registrations and transfers in 2010. Thanks for registering your Curlies !!!

*Buyers Checklist-

When you buy a Curly always ask about **registration papers** before you buy. It is always easier to buy a horse already registered, then all you need is a transfer. Find out if the horse is registered in multiple registries. If the horse is not registered anywhere, you are basically buying a grade horse. If the horse is eligible in ICHO, **be sure the seller provides you the needed paperwork, a signed breeder's certificate on the registration papers and a signed transfer form.** Always have a **contract**, always have a **bill of sale** and **cash receipt**. Buying a horse is no different than say buying a car, you need a title (registration or paperwork) a contract, Bill of Sale and Cash Receipt. Even if the horse is a gift, have a bill of sale marked as "Gift" as this proves ownership. It is also best to have a **health inspection (pre purchase exam)** done by your chosen vet before anything is signed or paid for. This is paid for by the buyer and results belong to the buyer unless the buyer agrees to give results to the seller. This is a disclosure of health, no different that buying a used car with a disclosure of mechanical details. Also ask the seller for the horses health record, has the horse ever founded, had surgery, been injured, sight problems, have any chronic health issues, vaccination record, worming record, etc.

Horse buyers are protected under consumer laws. If you see this listed in the contract- **"Horse is sold as is"** you will not have any recourse if the horse is ill or diseased or unfit for use, etc. **Do your homework before you buy and sign a contract and hand over cash**. It is also a good idea for **breeding horses to have a conformation inspection** before a sale. Know what is good and bad about a horse's conformation and movement so you know what you are breeding for if you buy this horse. It is always best to know what you are buying up front, not after. It can save you a lot of money down the line if something shows up in a pre purchase vet exam. Be sure the horse has the health you need to do the chosen sport or if buying for breeding. Is there a return guarantee if the horse is sterile? Buyers that ask all the right questions up front will be the happiest owners. Sellers that encourage buyers to do everything right up front have the smoothest sales and often have good repeat business. 
