

SOX FOR HORSES

This article is not necessarily the opinion of JCHO, but a news article to share with new ideas in horse care!

Sox For Horses, Inc. spends a great deal on it's proprietary yarn which is composed of a wicking yarn that draws moisture from the skin surface and the antimicrobial silver yarn maintains a clean environment around the legs useful for reducing dirt and debris near any pre-existing wounds, and reduce the bio-burden on the contact surface of the socks.

Every element in design and composition is about function on the equine leg. Hospitals were only beginning to use antimicrobial fabrics in their environments and nothing was being done back then in the equine industry in the way of using silver in equine garments. Sox For Horses, Inc. blazed trails in bringing silver to the attention of the equine garment industry.

Today, after many studies performed by on-the-ground owners, with horses that suffered from any number of skin issues or injuries, Summer Whinnys® Silver are fast being recognized by veterinarians as much more than effective fly protection.

Antimicrobial, breathing, and

wicking qualities make them a bandaging solution that provides all the key elements of protecting open sores and wounds. Summer Whinnys® Silver belong in the barn med chest all year around for when a bandage or leg protection is needed. Having proven their place far beyond great fly protection, SFHs is re-

naming these remarkable silver socks for horses. Look for new branding soon.

Sox For Horses, Inc is shortly to release "The Silver LiningTM" wrap/bandages. 

Dear fellow Curly-fans abroad,

With this short article we would like to let you know about our Curly promotion activities in the Netherlands. As you may, or may not know, the Dutch have a long history with horses; the Dutch warmblood and Friesian horses are well know all over the world and our dressage and jumping riders belong to the best in the world. At the moment there are only about 25 Curly Horses in our small country. Not nearly enough in our opinion compared to the huge equestrian scene we have here and a population of 400.000 horses. That's why we're working very hard on promoting our beloved Curly's! In the last few years we managed to get articles about Curly Horses in all Dutch Equine magazines and we finally notice that more and more people know about them.

This year we promoted our Curly's at the 3 day event 'Horse Event' for the second time. It is the largest equestrian event in our country with over 30.000 visitors. Our promotion horses were 7 year old mare Missouri's Sunshine (owned by Jessica Venhorst) and 6 year old breeding stallion CS Indian Fire (bred and owned by Claudia Spanjaard). At Horse Event people can see clinics and demonstrations at various different arena's all day, but the main attraction is the breeds parade where 20 tot 30 different breeds, divided into groups, are shown to the public twice a day. The organization was very pleased to have our rare Curly Horses in the parade. We presented Missouri's Sunshine under saddle and Indian Fire by hand so people could see his complete posture.

It is always very exciting to take your horse to such a big event. For Missouri's Sunshine it was the first time ever at an event, let alone such a big event. She behaved like she'd done it a million times before. The first day she had to get used to all the impressions and people, but never set one foot wrong. At the end of the day she was just loving all the attention and even followed people around to get some more! Taking a stallion to an event always brings an extra risk, especially during breeding season with many mares in heat around. However, Indian Fire also behaved super. He was excited around the mares, but once in the arena it was like he knew his job of walking around as the most relaxed stallion ever. The last day is always the busiest day with thousands of spectators. Among all the noise, applause and scary surroundings our great Curly's walked around like they had never done anything else. While other horses started spooking when the noise got to loud, ours just stayed cool. We were both so proud and even more in love with this wonderfull breed! Next year we plan on promoting our Curly's as much as possible at events and in competitions. It's not easy as there are only very few Curly's here and even less that are ridden and shown, but slowly we gain more awareness. Next year we hope we can even put up a little show, demonstrating the cool Curly personality and diversity. Any suggestions for this are more than welcome, as many of you have a lot of experience in promotion. Hopefully we can increase the Dutch Curly population quickly.


