- 1. We will use U of KY for all parentage DNA services, fee is lowered to \$30.00. All other DNA lab reports will need a recording fee of \$10.00 and will be entered in U of KY lab database. Owners submit manual entry excel form with data.
- 2. DNA testing is required for all active breeding ICHO/NACHR registered stallions starting in the breeding year 2012, and all future years, and will be required when the stallion report is filed by Feb 15, starting in 2013 and all years after.
- 3. The Gazette will be adding a \$10 fee for the year, to have a printed mailed version delivered through US mail.

I would like to present Joan Henning as our new president for 2012 and Trish Rosborough as our Vice president. I would also like to thank our two retiring board members, Allyn Babitch in "Reg. 2 and Karen Zierler who has given so much of her time as President and board member from Region 8. She is being replaced by Marianne Borneman. We feel very lucky that she has agreed to give her time, experience and great knowledge for the next 3 years. As I close, I want to thank all of our board members and staff who graciously give hours of their time and ideas to make this organization as good as it can be. 



# Last of the Saddle Tramps by Mesannie Wilkins, publisher Long Riders' Guild.

At almost 63 years of age Mesannie Wilkins found herself in a real bind. She was unmarried; broken in finances and body; all of her close family had passed away; she was in poor health, suffering from a lung infection, the doctor had told her that she had only a short time to live; she had lost her farm and home because of her poor health and her inability to work and lastly she had not ridden a horse in 30 years. Dear Reader, what would you do if you were in her shoes?

She did the most reasonable thing in the world, she bought a horse and with \$32 in her pocket set off on a 7,000 equestrian odyssey across the U.S! Here is how she described her decision to take this journey. "The decision to leave all that I had ever known and loved was the hardest one I'd ever made, but the Lord helped me make it, so I knew I was doing the right thing. Still, even with His help, it took me quite a spell to make up my mind. Maine women don't rush into things." So one November morning she told her horse and her dog, "California, here we come." She describes their reaction like this, "Had they known the meaning of my words, I suppose they would have hightailed it over the nearest hill. We loved each other, but they were way to smart to walk all the way to California just to satisfy an old woman's foolish whim."

Mesannie, her dog Depeche, and her horse Tarzan started off on their journey. It took them almost two years, but they reached California. Thev walked almost all of the way. They supported themselves by working their way across the na-They touched many lives because of the tion. kindness shown to them by strangers and because of the kindness that Mesannie gave to all those she met. There is one account of a lady who was afraid to leave her house. Yet this troubled lady came out of her house and, unable to speak because of her fear of being outside, gave Mesannie food for her journey. Mesannie wrote a note to this frightened lady. It read, "Thank you for your kindness to me, an old lady saddle tramp"

Mesannie describes how she became a good horsewoman by simply riding her horse. She gives the most insightful commentary on the social changes that occurred in the United States, during the middle of the last century, as she made her journey, that I have ever read. She tells of the kindness that she encountered and the friends that she made along the way. She tells of how she was

given a second horse so that she could carry more supplies for her trip. She tells of how her dog and her horse worked together to keep her from drowning. (That sounds unbelievable, I know. But it happened and she describes it in detail.)

Mesannie describes how she lost her beloved second horse, Rex. She explains how a driver used his car to assault her and Rex as they rode along the highway. After Rex was hurt, she explains how she made the worst decision that any horse person can ever make. By that I mean, she tells how she did not listen to her better judgment but allowed another person to tell her what to do and to do her thinking for her. The result was the painful death of Rex. She explains how she could never forgive herself for her own poor decision.

If you want to know what kind of a person Mesannie was and how she treated other people and animals, here is the prayer that her father taught her and that she prayed every day of her life. "Please, God, help those that need Thy help, regardless of race, creed, or color. As I'll pass this way but once, please lend me a guiding hand to help some one out from the ditch. I will not take Thy credit to myself."

Mesannie reached California. She had her dog, she had her old horse Tarzan, the one that started the journey with her, and she had her beloved horse King, who was given to her after Rex died. But most of all she was a horsewoman with love and joy in her heart. Oh yes, she lived a long time after reaching California. And she may have gone back to Wyoming to join the man who fell deeply in love with her. But we will never know if she did or not because she does not tell us.

Mesannie Wilkins tells the true account of her odyssey in a simple and plainly written way that will capture your mind and heart. I recommend this book highly.

# ICHO Stallions DNA requirements for breeding year 2012

ICHO has been registering Curly horses since 2000. In those past 11 years many Curly horses come to us that have for one reason or another, fallen through the cracks. Breeders not following through with signed documents, deceased breeders, deceased stallions, breeders unable to be found or refusing to follow up with needed paperwork. Horses going from owner to owner, lost papers, some ending up in rescue or auction. It makes tracing a horses actual pedigree almost impossible at times. Because of this problem and so many Curlies in this situation, ICHO has considered many options to help give Curlies their rightful pedigree. One way was keeping hair samples on file that could be DNA typed, which has been a huge help in many instances. Another option is having all ICHO registered breeding stallions DNA typed if breeding in 2012 and all years after. If all the breeding stallions had DNA on file, we would have an easier time finding a DNA match for offspring. This is extremely important when stallions are deceased before offspring are registered. ICHO feels this is a step in the right direction by requiring

all breeding stallions be DNA typed that are used for the breeding year 2012 and beyond and have their DNA type on file with ICHO by Feb 15th, 2013 when stallion reports are due. By having all breeding stallions tested, it makes it much easier to test offspring when needed.

We have many Curly horses already DNA typed as well as many stallions. What we would like to do is have all 2012 breeding stallions DNA on file in 2013 and all years after, that have been used for breeding. We encourage breeders to DNA type all their breeding horses including mares, but at this time we are only requiring breeding stallions be typed. DNA Testing Lab used by ICHO for parentage testing~

ICHO has always used U of KY for their DNA typing lab. They have a huge database with all the ICHO Curlies tested since our beginnings. For parentage verification, one lab database needs to be used for it to work for typing because the data is already in there to make a match. So for all DNA typing ICHO requires testing be done at U of KY for parentage through U of KY. To help with costs, we are lowering our DNA fee to \$30.00 for U of KY typing. We will accept DNA reports from other labs for a \$10.00 recording fee and a copy of the lab report. ICHO will then manually enter and submit the other lab results into U of KY's database. All Ancestral horses tested in 2011 are now entered in the U of KY database. In 2012 it will require the \$10.00 recording fee to enter the DNA markers from TX A&M.

#### Letter submitted by Sandra Hendrickson, President

To those who will be making selections for the Cowgirl Museum and the Hall of Fame, I would like to submit the name of one of the greatest ladies in my life, Sunny Martin, whose life is a perfect example of someone who should be wearing these top honors sparkling in her crown of the big cowboy hat she was never without. My first meeting with her was over the phone as I was seeking information on the unique curly haired horse. The Bashkir Curly, which she had made famous and in fact started the American Curly Horse Registry back in the 70's. When Sunny put her mind to something, she had that rare ability to do it extremely well, and included the personal touch whereas anyone in her audience knew they were someone special and that she was talking directly to them. I attended many ABC conventions in her hometown of Ely Nevada. She always ran them, Planned all the meals and activities as well as ran the meetings and set up the entertainment and frequently had a cowboy poet. One time, I remember well, about 25 yrs. ago, a very young boy whose parents led him up on stage and then proceeded to delight us with his many recitations of cowboy poems loved this poetry. I had never heard cowboy poetry before she started reading and reciting it to me or to our group when we would visit at her home at convention time. Sometimes when we were alone she would get out her books of cowboy poetry and read her favorites aloud. She also had so many memorized. She always gave her favorite cowboy poets credit. When I told her she should be a cowgirl poet, she then told me that she was and kept me informed of her many jaunts into her 80's where she would travel by herself and her trusty 25yr old car through snowstorms, icy weather or fair, kind of like the postman, to attend any of these events-often performing herself but also just be there. Sunny Martin was a true cowgirl. She rode horses all of her life and taught the younger set of Ely, Nevada, for many years how to compete and care for their horses in the 4H programs and others. She also loved history and participated in the Ely museum. The cowboy poet greats were always displayed there as well. She rode her favorite curly horse, PelloCheno, in the Rose Parade when she was in her 70's.Getting dressed up to Sunny was to get out her fanciest Western buckled belt and best western Britches. I live in Indiana so she would mail me long poems that she really liked. One time I said Sunny, could you record that poem you just read and send it to me. She did but unfortunately, when I got it, it was hard to distinguish. When I told her this and how sorry I was, she said" Well, I don't know how that could have happened as I went into the john and sat there with the door closed so there would not be any interference". There never was a more ideal person to receive these high awards. All of her life she contributed to the people, the horses, the poetry readers and country musicians. She gave her quick wit, high intelligence, imagination and wonderful speaking ability to bring the West and what it was and had been to the world.

#### ICHO/NACHR BREEDERS GUIDE

Welcome to the wonderful world of Curly breeding. ICHO would like to offer these guidelines for breeders so everyone knows what is required and what is expected from every Curly breeder to have a successful breeding experience and registering their offspring with ICHO.

**Choosing your stallions and mares**. This is a very personal choice for each breeder. We would like to advise that you have a clear plan before breeding Curlies.

1. What type of Curly are you are breeding for? Choose the right horses for the right discipline/type you want to produce. If you are breeding for a sport type, western type or pony or gaited, be sure you have the type of Curly you need to produce that specific type of horse. One of the best ways to start a breeding program is find a suitable stud and mares from an established breeder that has proven their stock in the area of your goals. *Example- find the Curly type you want and then find the breeder that has been most successful in producing that type.* 

2. <u>Conformation, movement, temperament-</u> Ideally you want the best balanced combination of these three things. Good conformation is very important in choosing a breeding horse. But a perfect conformation and a bad temperament is not a good choice for breeding because all these things are genetically influenced and passed on. We do not want to breed for bad temperaments. Movement is tied to conformation, how a horse is put together affects how it moves. The best way to know how this horse fairs as a breeding choice is have the horse inspected for conformation, movement and temperament. Using NACHIP live inspections is a good choice and finding a horse already inspected is a great choice.

<u>Genetics</u>- Always be aware of what breed genetics are in your horse of choice. Test for all known genetic diseases associated with those breeds. It is advised that you breed only horses that have tested clear. Some diseases to look for are CA, HYPP, HERDA, DSLD/ESPA and others.

#### Breeding Stallions reporting and requirements

- <u>DNA</u>- All breeding stallions used for breeding in the year 2012 and all future years are required to be DNA typed and entered into the U of KY database.
- Stallion Reports- all stallions are required to submit a stallion report, even if not used, due Feb 15, following the breeding year. Examplebreeding year 2011, stallion reports due Feb 15, 2012. If a stallion is leased, the lessee is required to submit a report as well as owner if both used this stallion.
- <u>Breeding Certificates</u>- all stallions standing to outside mares require the stallion owner sign a breeding certificate for the mare owner. This proves that the stallion owner approved this breeding to said mare on the dates listed and how the breeding was done. (ex- hand, pasture, AI) This breeding certificate is given to the mare owner after breeding, you also keep one copy for yourself. These signed breeding certificates are required for registering the foals.

Mares- if your mare is bred, we need a breeders certificate signed by the mare owner at time of breeding to verify the breeding for foals.

- If you own or lease the mare and stallion at time of breeding, you sign as mare owner/lessee and stallion owner/lessee. If you are standing your mare to an outside stallion you the sign breeding certificate as mare owner and you must get a breeding certificate signed by the stallion owner to register the foal. This verifies breeder and pedigree of stallion and mares.
- Caring for pregnant mares. Pregnant mares have special nutritional needs in the last months of pregnancy and lactating months. Their protein requirements are higher and their ration must be balanced. There have been many great books written on the subject and we suggest all breeders know what these requirements are. Also worming schedules are important for pregnant mares and foals.

#### Foals-

- When your foals are born, document the day of birth, type of curl and color. Also it is a good idea to take a photo to refer to. All foals need a date of birth and place of birth for registration.
- Caring for foals requires knowing what their nutritional requirements are as well as their socialization needs with humans and other horses. Books are written about this subject from imprinting to caring for an orphaned foal and how to wean. We suggest reading up on these most important subjects that all breeders need to know. It is much easier to sell handled friendly foals than unhandled.

#### Selling Offspring-

- All horses you breed for and foal on your farm- As a breeder you are the first owner. If you sell a horse it requires a registration and transfer to new owner. First buyer is the second owner.
- It is the breeders responsibility to provide all necessary paperwork signed and given to the first buyer to transfer this horse into their name. Signature are required from the breeder and seller.
- This means we need proof of ownership with a signed transfer form. We request that all horses be registered by the breeder so that all the new buyer needs is a signed transfer form and the registration certificate. If the horse is not registered yet, it is the breeder's responsibility to supply all necessary registration forms filled out and signed for the new owner. This is not the new owner's responsibility to fill out forms, it is the breeders. When you sell a horse as a breeder always provide these things:

A. Sales Contract- this lists terms and what is required of seller and buyer and details about the horse being sold and purchased.

**B.** Bill Of Sale- this is the verification of change of ownership and exchange of money. This seals the deal.

C. Cash receipt- this is what shows the amount, how paid & date. It is like a cash register receipt and proves a purchase.

D. Registration certificate- this always goes with the horse once the sale is final and is a required ICHO procedure.

**E. Transfer form**-Always provide a transfer form signed so the new buyer can transfer this horse into their name. Tell the buyer they must send the transfer and the certificate to the ICHO office with fees. As a seller you can also do this for the buyer, as it makes for a smooth sale. Do all you can for the buyer and they will return and tell their friends how wonderful it was dealing with you.
